<u>Highlights from the Board of</u> <u>Trustees/Endowment</u> <u>Meetings:</u>

There were a number of attendees in this year's gallery. Again, attendee were not given an agenda so things were a little hard to follow since we do not any have any background on what was being discussed.

It was reported that the AAMA Facebook page had 20,000 "likes." AAMA has approximate 28.000+ members.

The Certifying Board was recognized for 50 years of Service to the organization.

In an addendum report from the Policy and Procedures committee, Boni Bruntz presented and it was approved by the BOT that they accept the social media guidelines as established.

Reports will be then reviewed and handled by only the AAMA's attorney, Don Balasa, JD, MBA. It was suggested to one of the elected Trustees that this process be

done yearly on those people, because sometimes 'issues' are in process when a check is done and thus would not show up on a check until after the matter is handled in a court of law. She was going to mention this to the BOT.

Lisa Lee, CMA (AAMA), Awards Chair gave an addendum report. Since her term as chair of this committee is ending, she suggested that the BOD and the new chair and committee review the current criteria used to determine award winners. She feels that an update is needed. as the current criteria eliminates many candidates the way it is weighted. She also feels that AAMA should recognize people for work done on the state level. and not overlook their efforts because they do not wish to move on to work on the national level.

Julie Flaatten, chair of the Professional Expansion and Awareness Task Force presented the new AAMA Core Values and it was approved by the BOD. The BOD also approved the new Mission and Vision statement presented. However, the Vision statement was defeated in the House of Delegates.

Carmen Kittleson, CEB chair, received BOD approval for numerous updates to the CEB Policies and Procedures manual.

The AAMA has established a Technology Reserve fund of \$250,000 to be used for comput-

er and software upgrades in the AAMA headquarters. It will take 18 to 24 month to phase the installation in, but in the end for example, members will be able to pay their membership online and print out an accurate receipt as proof of payment. upgrade will help to elevate some of the duties that the current staff must do manually. leaving them more time to be "membership focused" for more oneon-one time to answer questions. deal with issue, etc. In addition, it should speed up many of the daily tasks, cut down on postage, paper costs, and the overlapping of notices that have been taken care of already, i.e. membership renewal, certification renewal.

The CEB is looking into other electronic learning ideas to entice members. One new item this year is they will offer a free CEU by podcasts. They are going to extend the deadline this year to include all of Medical Assistant week (Oct 18-20, 2011) in an effort to attract vounger CMAs who are used to this type of technology and regular members who are not, but may like it if given a chance to use it. Another idea they are looking into is doing a CEU from a live webinar.

Leadership A Training:

Chris Hollander, CMA (AAMA), Speaker of the House and Nina Watson, CMA (AAMA), CPC, Vice Speaker of the House,

reviewed the rules of the HOD and its' proceedings. Proper procedure for addressing the House, and making motions during the HOD were discussed, however, again, proper voting procedures were not reviewed for casting ballots. Again, a handout on "The a-b-c's of Parliamentary Procedure" was given to attendees. General questions on the rules of the HOD were asked by attendees and answered.

It was stated, that is in writing now, that the ballots cast for each House of Delegates are now going to be given to Kathy Langley for storage for 30 days and then destroyed if there is no contesting of the votes cast for that House of Delegates. Last year Nebraska tried to contest what was reported at the House of Delegates as votes cast and the ballots had been destroyed even before the House closed.

Dessert Social/Excel Awards:

Members gather at this event to find out, and honor the EXCEL winners and mingle socially, while dining on a variety of desserts. A power point presentation announced the evening's winners.

In category C 501-800 members, Nebraska won two EXCEL awards this year, one for membership recruitment and one for the publishing of the Med-A-Gram.

The "Leadership and Mentoring" award went to Loxie Kistler, EdD, RN, CMA (AAMA). The "Golden Apple" award went to Cheryl Vineyard, CMA (AAMA), CPC, BUS.

The FA Davis Student Award now issues two \$500 cash awards to the student who submits the best essay and one for best video stating, "Why I became a Medical Assistant..." The essay winner was Colleen Buckley-Gatto, from Heald College, Concord, CA and the video winner was from a group of students that attend Northcentral Technical College in Wasau, WI.

<u>President and President Elect</u> <u>Advisory Council on Saturday:</u>

State leaders attending did an exercise trying to solve their own state issues again-this one being on increasing membership. Each group was to think of a name of a state and then within that state, if money was not issue, describe what we would do to recruit new members and entice regular members into becoming more active in the organization.

State presents and attendees were given lapel pins that say, "Who I am makes a difference." There were letters explain what to do with the pins given to the state presidents, along with instructions that if they were interested in getting more they should contact AAMA.

House of Delegates:

The House of Delegates was called to order by the Speaker of the House, Chris Hollander, CMA (AAMA). The presentation of colors, and the Pledge of Allegiance were done and the National Anthem was sung.

Three states had to ask permission to be seated at the HOD:

Georgia, New Jersey and Virginia. Votes were cast and the states were allowed to be seated. It was never presented to the HOD why they needed permission to be seated.

The rules of the House were not read since they were mailed out to delegates on time per the Bylaws. Total voting power of this HOD was 127.

Nebraska joined the meet and greet with the candidates running for AAMA office after the close of the first session of the HOD. Again, the time allotted to meet the candidates was not enough; we were only able to talk to 4 candidates in the time given.

The Reference Committee reports were given and all AAMA members were given a chance to voice their opinions and concerns over them.

Committee report presented to the HOD

All committee reports were accepted as written or amended.

Bylaws presented to the HOD

There were no bylaws amendments presented to the House this year.

Resolutions:

There was one resolution presented this year, but it was defeated in the House.

The Marketplace Luncheon:

We no longer have the Marketplace Luncheon with a free box lunch on Sundays. It is now called the Publishers Showcase and we are offered a desert and drink. The Publisher






